	Question	Answer
1.	<p>a. Given that the minimum grant amount is \$200,000 is it permissible to bundle several projects together to meet that funding threshold? Specifically:</p> <p>b. is it allowable to specify multiple project locations if the technology employed is the same, and;</p> <p>c. the applicant proposes to apply the grant funds to multiple projects owned by independent parties?</p>	<p>1a. Yes. It is permissible to bundle several projects together to meet the funding threshold as long as the projects have the same owner and each project individually is NOT eligible for one of the current incentive/rebate programs offered by the NH PUC. For example, a proposal from a town to install wood chip boiler heating systems in each of several town buildings together into a larger “project” would be allowable as each system individually would not be eligible for any of the Incentive Programs currently operated. Further, the PUC would be contracting with a single entity (the town) and all of the individual systems would be owned by the same entity (the town).</p> <p>1b. Yes, if the technology employed will create energy and/or heat and therefore renewable energy certificates as required by the RFP and the RECs can be tracked and attributed to each separate installation then the proposal would not be deemed non-conforming.</p> <p>1c. No. This approach would be deemed non-conforming as such a proposal would invest in projects with multiple independent owners.</p>
