Dear Ms. Howland and Mr. Moore:

As discussed at the November 5, 2008 technical session, I enclose a CD containing an Excel spreadsheet and a printout of that file setting forth One Communications' revised calculation of the CCL charges that Verizon billed to the One Communications operating entities during the period from May 2004 through the April 2008 bills.

One Communications considers the information contained in the attached estimate to be confidential and proprietary and commercially and competitively sensitive, and therefore is providing the spreadsheets only to the Commission Staff, pursuant to RSA 378:43, and to Verizon New Hampshire, pursuant to the terms of our protective agreement dated as of February 12, 2007. The information or records provided are not general public knowledge or published elsewhere; measures have been taken by One Communications to prevent dissemination of the information or records in the ordinary course of business; and the information or records pertains to the provision of competitive services and sets forth confidential financial or commercial information, including geographic, market, vendor, or product-specific data, such as usage information not reflected in tariffs of general application.

In compiling these figures, One Communications also looked at the CCL charge information that Verizon provided in connection with the November 5 technical session. Verizon's data often differ from One Communications' data, sometimes by a minor amount, but sometimes substantially. Communications entities lacking invoices or other data. In an effort to ensure that all potential charges are accounted for, when calculating the amounts billed, One Communications used the larger of the Verizon or One Communications figures. One Communications believes that this is evident on the spreadsheet, but if it is not clear, we would be happy to explain this further.
