THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION DRM 08-148 ORDER OF NOTICE

On May 1, 2009, the Commission voted pursuant to RSA 541-A to initiate a rulemaking for N.H. Admin. Rule Puc 900, Rules for Net Metering for Customer-Owned Renewable Energy Generation Resources of 100 Kilowatts or Less. The Commission's initial proposal consists of a readoption with amendment of existing Interim Rule Puc 900 Rules for Net Metering for Customer-Owned Renewable Energy Generation Resources of 100 Kilowatts or Less as a result of modifications to RSA 362-A by the passage of HB 447 (2007). The proposed rule establishes reasonable interconnection requirements for safety, reliability and power quality for net energy metering as the public interest requires consistent with the legislative declaration of purpose set forth in RSA 362-A:1. Specifically, the proposed rule sets forth definitions of terms, general rules, rights and obligations, statutory and other requirements, requirements relating to the interconnection application process, technical requirements for interconnection, description of compliance paths for units using and not using an inverter to interface with the electrical grid, and procedural requirements for all interconnected units.

At this time, the current version of Puc 900 has been adopted as an interim rule effective January 12, 2009 that is due to expire on July 11, 2009. The proposed rule will replace the current version of

Puc 900.

A rulemaking notice form (Notice) was filed with the Office of Legislative Services on May 12, 2009 pursuant to RSA 541-A:6. The Notice, attached hereto, sets forth a date for a public hearing to be held at the Commission and a deadline for submission of written comments.

A copy of the Rulemaking Notice will be sent to all regulated utilities and to those parties have requested notice of rulemakings pertaining to net metering for customer-owned renewable energy generation resources of 100 kilowatts or less. Pursuant to RSA-541-A:6, III, notice may also be provided by public notice advertisement in a publication of daily statewide circulation.

The readoption with amendment may be viewed on the Commission website, www.puc.nh.gov, or copies may be obtained from the Commission as set forth in the Notice.

Based upon the foregoing, it is here-

ORDERED, that a Public Hearing, pursuant to 541-A:11, be held before the Commission located at 21 S. Fruit St., Suite 10, Concord, New Hampshire on June 18, 2009 at 11:00 a.m., and that the deadline for submission of materials in writing or via e-mail shall be June 25,

2009, as set forth in the Notice; and it is **FURTHER ORDERED**, that pursuant to RSA 541-A:6,III, the Commission shall undertake a public notice advertisement by publishing a copy of this Order together with the Notice no later than May 21,

2009, in a newspaper with a daily statewide circulation, publication to be docu-mented by affidavit filed with the Commission on or before June 18, 2009.

6. (a) Summary of what the rule says and the effect of the rule on those regu-

The purpose of Puc 900 is to establish reasonable interconnection requirements for safety, reliability and power quality for customer owned renewable energy generation resources of 100 kilowatts or less (previously 25 kilowatts or less before HB447).

Specifically, the proposed rule sets forth definitions of terms, general rules, rights and obligations, statutory and other requirements, requirements relating to the interconnection application process, technical requirements for interconnection, description of separate compliance paths for units using inverters or meters to interface with the electrical grid and procedural requirements for all interconnected units. The changes to the proposed rule result from 1) passage of HB 47 (2007) which modified the definition of eligible customer-generator and required the PUC to conform to certain safety standards when adopting its rules, 2) the Commission's adoption of the IEEE Standard 1547 for inverter interconnections up to 10 kilowatts, and 3) the need to update the incor-porated standard references to reflect the most recent editions.

Net energy metering is a way to provide a reasonable opportunity for small customers to choose interconnected self generation, to encourage private investment in renewable energy resources, to stimulate in-state commercialization of innovative and beneficial new technology, to enhance the future diversification of the state's energy resource mix, and reduce interconnection and administrative costs.

6. (b) Brief description of the groups affected: Any person or entity which seeks to interconnect to the electric grid with a renewable energy generation resource of 100 kilowatts or less in capacity. Additionally affected are electric utilities which distribute electric power within the State of New Hampshire and electric suppliers within the state as defined in the rule.
