

Dear Ms. Howland:

The OCA would like to bring to the Commission’s attention a recent order by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) that bears on the preemption issue in this proceeding. On December 2, 2009, in the matter of Schools and Libraries Universal Service Support Mechanism, CC Docket No. 02-6, the FCC stated:

We also adopt USAC’s proposal that interconnected VoIP be listed in both the telecommunications and Internet access categories of the ESL, despite the fact that the Commission has not yet determined the regulatory classification of interconnected VoIP.
