SUMMARY OF THE PETITION

On March 24, 2011, Public Service Company of New Hampshire (PSNH or the Company) filed a petition pursuant to RSA 371:17 requesting a license to construct and maintain electric lines over and across the public waters of Sagamore Creek in the City of Portsmouth, New Hampshire.

The project proposed in PSNH's petition will involverelocating athree-phase 12.47 kV distribution line by shifting it slightly further east (approximately six feet) of the currentcrossing location. PSNH states that it previously constructed and currently operates and maintain-sthe line, designated as the 2W4 circuit,

in Portsmouthand that the line isan integral part of PSNH's electric distribution system in the area. The line, as currently constructed, crosses over Sagamore Creek approximately sixfeet east of the Route 1A (Sagamore Avenue) bridge.

PSNH asserts that in order to meet the reasonable requirements of service to the public, it needsto relocate the line to accommodate the New Hampshire Department of Transportation (NHDOT), which is replacingthe existing bridge in this location with a new, wider bridge structure.PSNH reports that there is no known Commission license for the existing 2W4 linecrossing; the relocation of the 2W4 line crossing will be newly licensed underthis petition.

Crossing Location and Construction According to the petition, the new poles associated with this crossing are to be located within theRoute 1A (Sagamore Avenue) right of way administered by the City ofPortsmouth.

PSNH states that the proposed crossing willbe constructed between two new wood structures to be setwith a span length of approximately 463 feet. The new structure on the north side of thecreek, number 136/46, is a dead end structure, constructed with a single class H2, 65-foot pole. The new structure on the south side of the creek, number 136/49, is also a deadend structure, constructed with a single class H2, 65-foot pole. The existing conductor wires (336 ACSR with 18/1 stranding) will be reused. The existingneutral will be replaced with 4/0 ACSR,

6/1 stranding.

Clearance and Sag Requirements

According to PSNH, the conductors will be saggedusing NESC Heavy Loading conditions (0°F, 4 pounds psf wind loading, 1/2-inch radial ice)at a maximum tension of 2,500 pounds. The neutral will be sagged using NESC HeavyLoading conditions at a maximum tension of 2,000 lbs. PSNH notes that a 100-year flood elevation of 11 feet applies at the cross-

PSNH used the above design criteria to determine and design the maximum sags of the phase and neutralwires and minimum clearances for the crossing. Due to the proximity of the bridge, the centerline elevation of the bridge wasassumed as the reference point for clearances to land, which, according to PSNHresults in a more conservative calculation thanwould measuring to actual ground.

PSNH adds that the nearest proposed conductor will belocated approximately

waters, as required for approval under RSA 371:20. We find the crossing is in the public good and therefore approve the petition on a nisi basis, subject to the conditions recommended by the Safety Division. Our decision is issued on a nisi basis in order to provide any interested party the opportunity to submit com-ments on PSNH's petition or to request a hearing. Finally, inasmuch as NHDES is responsible by statute for maintaining the official list of public waters and given NHDOT's oversight of the bridge construction project, we determine that notice of the proposed crossings to the NHDES and the NHDOT is warranted.

The petition and subsequent docket filings, other than information for which confidential treatment is requested of or granted by the Commission, is posted to the Commission's website at http:// www.puc.nh.gov/Regulatory/Docketbk/2011/11-060.html.

Based upon the foregoing, it is here-

ORDERED NISI, that subject to the effective date below, PSNH is authorized, pursuant to RSA 371:17 et seq., to construct, maintain and operate electric and other lines over and across the public waters described in its petition and depicted in itsfiling; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that all construction and future alterations to this approved crossing shall conform to the requirements of the National Electrical Safety Code, in accordance with N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 306.01 and Puc 1303.07 and all other applicable safety standards in existence at that time; and

FURTHER ORDERED, that PSNH submit any future proposed alterations to the crossing license granted herein at least 60 days prior to any such alteration;

FURTHER ORDERED, that copies of all permits, if any, required by the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services for these crossings be filed with

this Commission; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that copies of all permits, if any, required by the New Hampshire Department of Transportation for these crossings be filed with this Commission; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that copies of all licenses or permits, if any, required by the City of Portsmouth for these crossings be filed with this Commission; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that PSNH shall provide a copy of this order to the (i) City Clerk of Portsmouth, New Hampshire, (ii) New Hampshire Attorney General and the owners of the land bordering on said public waters at the location of the crossing, pursuant to RSA 371:19, (iii) the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services, and (iv) pursuant to RSA 422-B:13, the New Hampshire Department of Transportation and the Office of Secretary, U.S. Department of Commerce by first class mail, no later than April 20, 2012, and to be documented by affidavit filed with this office on or before May 10, 2012: and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that the Petitioner shall cause a copy of this Order Nisi to be published once in a statewide newspaper of general circulation or of circulation in those portions of the state where operations are conducted, such publication to be no later than April 20, 2012 and to be documented by affidavit filed with this office on or before May 10, 2012; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that all persons interested in responding to this Order Nisi be notified that they may submit their comments or file a written request for a hearing which states the reason and basis for a hearing no later than April 27, 2012 for the Commission's consideration; and it is

There will be a hearing before the Honorable David K. Wheeler, designee of the Governor and Council, in Conference Room B, 5th Floor of St. Joseph Hospital, 172 Kinsley Street, Nashua, New Hampshire on Thursday, April 26, 2012 at 10:00 a.m. The hearing is open to the public and is held pursuant to the provisions of NHRSA 195-D:21 and Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, with regard to the proposed issuance of up to \$35,000,000 of Revenue Bonds (the "Bonds") in one or more series by the New Hampshire Health and Education Facilities Authority (the "Authority") to provide for a plan of financing and refinancing for St. Joseph Hospital of Nashua, N.H., Nashua, New Hampshire, (the "Hospital"), and Covenant Health Systems, Inc., Tewksbury Massachusetts (the "Institution"). Approximately \$8,500,000 of bond proceeds are to be applied toward the refunding of prior debt, as described herein, and approximately \$26,500,000 of bond proceeds are to be applied toward various new money projects, as further described herein, as follows: (A) to current refund the Authority's Healthcare System Revenue Bonds, Covenant Health Systems Obligated Group Issue, Series 2002, the proceeds of which were used to: (1) refinance the Authority's Hospital Revenue Bonds, St. Joseph Hospital Issue, Series 1991, dated October 15, 1991 (the "Series 1991 Bonds"), the proceeds of which were used to: (a) renovate, expand and reconfigure the Hospital's facility located at 172 Kinsley Street in Nashua, New Hampshire (the "Nashua Campus"), which resulted in a renovation and construction of a new addition to the existing hospital facilities; (b) acquire approximately 249 parking spaces of a 456 space parking facility, located directly behind the Nashua Campus and a condominium unit, located at 166 Kinsley Street, Nashua, used for administrative office space by the Hospital; (c) construct an addition to the Hospital's emergency/ outpatient facilities located at 130 Nash-Street, Milford, New Hampshire (the "Milford Facility"), including a parking facility; (d) acquire and install certain capital equipment that is used at the Nashua Campus and the Milford Facility, including electric beds, computer equipment, a transcription system and a fluoroscopy unit; (e) renovate certain interior areas at the Nashua Campus; (f) refinance certain existing indebtedness of the Hospital originally used to finance the acquisition of the land for the Milford Facility and the outpatient surgery waiting area
