OFFICE OF CONSUMER ADVOCATE'S NOTICE OF RESERVATION OF RIGHTS CONCERNING VERIZON'S RESPONSES TO GROUP I, SET 1, DATA REQUESTS

The Office of Consumer Advocate (OCA) hereby notifies the N.H. Public Utilities Commission (Commission), Verizon New England, Inc. (Verizon NE), Bell Atlantic Communications, Inc., NYNEX Long Distance Co., and Verizon Select Services, Inc. (collectively, Verizon), the other parties and Commission Staff that the OCA reserves its rights to compel the responses of Verizon to certain Group I, set 1, data requests and to propound additional data requests concerning the subjects covered by the OCA's Group I, set 1. In support, the OCA states the following:

1. The procedural schedule in this docket provides for the filing today of second motions to compel responses to disputed Group I data requests.¹

2. Pursuant to the procedural schedule, the OCA propounded data requests to Verizon on April 6, 2007. These data requests concerned Group I, Transactional and Financial Issues.²

3. On April 27, 2007, the OCA received Verizon's responses to all of these data requests except: OCA 1-4, 1-5, 1-6, 1-9, 1-10, 1-11, 1-12, 1-13, 1-14, 1-15, 1-16, 1-18, 1-22, 1-26, 1-28, 1-54, 1-101, 1-107, 1-109, 1-110, 1-113, 1-114, 1-123, and 1-131.³

4. On May 1, 2007, the OCA received supplemental responses or errata to OCA 1-24, 1-42, 1-96, and 1-124.

5. On May 15, Verizon provided responses to OCA 1-5, 1-6, 1-16, 1-22, 1-54, 1-60, 1-69, 1-70, 1-71, 1-72, 1-101, 1-107, 1-109 and 1-110.

6. Of the responses received from Verizon on April 27, the OCA has identified 14 that are incomplete, erroneous or not responsive: OCA 1-24, 1-27, 1-57, 1-59, 1-60, 1-65, 1-66, 1-73, 1-88, 1-89, 1-93, 1-97, 1-24 and 1-127.

7. Between May 9th and May 17th, the OCA, in good faith, provided Verizon written summaries of its concerns about these data requests and engaged in discussions with Verizon in an attempt to avoid the filing of a motion to compel. *See* Puc 203.09(i)(4).

8. As a result of these exchanges, the OCA and Verizon resolved, at least for the time being, the OCA's concerns about these data responses, and the company agreed to provide supplemental responses to most of them.

9. Verizon's responses, however, are due after the deadline for filing this motion to compel.

10. In agreeing to accept, for the time being, Verizon's offer to provide further response to its Group I, set 1 data requests, the OCA does not waive its rights to compel further responses to these data requests or to propound additional data requests concerning the subjects covered by the OCA's Group I, set 1.

In lieu of a hearing on the OCA's April 20 motion to compel, the OCA and Verizon reached an agreement on the remaining disputed data requests (i.e., OCA 1-4, 1-5, 1-6, 1-9, 1-10, 1-11, 1-12, 1-13, 1-14, 1-15, 1-16, 1-18, 1-22, 1-26, 1-28, 1-54, 1-101, 1-107, 1-109, 1-110, 1-113, and 1-114).

11. As such, the OCA reserves these rights and hereby notifies the Commission,

Verizon, other parties and Staff of this reservation of rights.
