Anne and all,

Union Telephone Company and BayRing Communications cannot agree to fact number 9 "Global Naps does not originate traffic".

Upon review of detailed call records received from Verizon/FairPoint (for calls which terminate to our customers) we find several calls that contain a from number that is assigned to Global Naps, Inc. The originating (or from) number is assigned to Global Naps, Inc. and to the best of our knowledge the number has not been ported to another carrier. The attached schedule summarizes information contained in the Local Exchange Routing Guide (LERG) for three examples of NPA/NXX combinations we found in our call detail records from Verizon which indicates Global Naps OCN as the originating OCN. The schedule also shows the LERG information for OCN#4976 (overall OCN 4975), for which these NPA/NXX combinations are assigned to. These three 10,000 block of numbers are assigned to Global Naps, Inc. (see "CO NAME (SPECIFIC):" on the attached schedule).

Since originating numbers are assigned to (and are being used by a Global Naps, Inc. end users), then Global Naps, Inc. does originate traffic and thus we recommend that fact number 9 be removed from the stipulation of facts.
