


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Dear Director Howland:

On July 31, 2014, the Commission issued Order No. 25,699 in the above-referenced docket and, among other things, approved an agreement to revise certain of Public Service Company of New Hampshire's ("PSNH") charges to competitive electric power suppliers operating in PSNH's service territory. The Commission also ordered PSNH to reconcile the newly approved permanent charges with the temporary charges previously approved. In this docket, and coincident with this submission, PSNH has provided the Commission with a description of the manner of the reconciliation and refund, as well as relevant supporting materials. PSNH is not, however, able to reconcile the amount relating to complete the reconciliation, and requests that the Commission provide direction relative to these entities.
