On May 29, 2013, Granite State Electric Company d/b/a Liberty Utilities, the Office of Consumer Advocate, Mary Hitchcock Memorial Hospital and Dartmouth-Hitchcock (intervenor) and Staff agreed to a settlement in principle regarding Liberty's request for a temporary rate increase in the above-captioned docket. The parties intend to file a written settlement agreement on May 31, 2013.

The hearing on the petition for temporary rates is scheduled for June 4, 2013. Because the parties are unable to file the settlement agreement 5 days prior to the hearing as required by N.H.
