Dear Mr. Wyatt:

On July 11, 2014 the Commission received an email from Knollwood Energy of MA, LLC (Knollwood Energy) on behalf Robert Wyatt (Wyatt). Attached to the email was a letter signed by Robert Wyatt requesting the transfer of REC eligibility for the Wyatt photovoltaic array, from Solar Farm Bank, LLC (SFB), (NON 35889), to the Knollwood Energy aggregation, pursuant to Puc 2505.12. The Commission originally certified the Wyatt photovoltaic array as a Class II renewable energy source effective as of August 15, 2013.

The nameplate capacity of the Wyatt array is 0.0098 megawatts; the facility's new New England Power Pool (NEPOOL) Generation Information System facility code is NON 41624. Knollwood Energy was approved as an aggregator of New Hampshire customer-sited sources effective as of September 13, 2013<sup>1</sup>, pursuant to Puc 2506.

Since the facility is a customer-sited source, its output is not recorded in the NEPOOL Market Settlement System and, as a result, its output must be monitored and verified by an independent monitor. Paul Button will continue to monitor the facility's output as required by the New Hampshire Code of Administrative Rules Puc 2505.08(b)(5).

Staff has reviewed the request for transfer of REC eligibility and recommends approval of the transfer. Based on Staff's recommendation, the Commission hereby approves the Wyatt transfer to Knollwood Energy effective July 11, 2014.

Attached please find a copy of the notice of this transfer provided to the GIS administrator.

Please be advised that, pursuant to RSA 362-F, the Commission has approved the transfer of renewable energy certificate (REC) eligibility for the Robert Wyatt (Wyatt) photovoltaic (PV) facility from Solar Farm Bank, LLC (Solar Farm Bank) to the Knollwood Energy of MA, LLC (Knollwood Energy) aggregation.
