      have changed in light of the Settlement Agreement that was

       presented to the Commission in the 2013 reconciliation

       docket, 14-120. We don't have an order on that yet. But,

       presuming the order approves that Settlement Agreement, we

       will need to make some updates to address that.

       have an initial position. We look forward to
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investigating the filing and working with the Company and 1 2 Staff. 3 HEARINGS EXAMINER ROSS: Okay. 4 MS. AMIDON: I'll stand up, so I can see 5 you. Staff has not -- you know, has received the filing, and we've taken a look at it. Preliminarily, we don't 6 7 observe any unusual aspects of this filing, except for the one referred to by Attorney Fossum, regarding something 8 that hopefully will be resolved in the prior docket. 9 10 We will commence discovery and have a 11 proposed procedural schedule to discuss with the parties 12 after this prehearing conference, and we'll report back to 13 the Commission. 14 HEARINGS EXAMINER ROSS: Okay. In that 15 case, I don't think we have anything further that we need 16 to cover in the prehearing conference. 17 So, I will close the conference, and ask 18 that the parties meet and try to work out a recommended 19 procedural schedule that they can submit as soon as 20 possible to the Commission. 21 MS. AMIDON: Yes. 22 HEARINGS EXAMINER ROSS: Is there a 23 deadline for this order to be issued for the 24 reconciliation? When are the proposed rates going to be
