As a result of notice and hearing, the following changes (described below or in an attachment) have been made to this proposed rule which affect the original fiscal impact statement, and the agency hereby requests an amended fiscal impact statement:

The Final Proposal for the Public Utilities Commission's Puc 2000 rules for competitive electric power suppliers (CEPS) and aggregators revises the renewal registration period for CEPS to make it three years under all circumstances, rather than varying periods based on the term of the financial security instrument. The revised rules amendments also require submission of additional application materials by CEPS which intend to enroll residential customers through in-person solicitation at the customer's residence, and specific provisions regarding the timing and conduct of in-person solicitation of residential customers at their residences.

Finally, as of the date of this filing, there are 31 registered CEPS and 116 registered electric load aggregators in New Hampshire.
