I respectfully request that the Public Utilities Commission deny Liberty Utilities a Declaratory Ruling on their franchise request for Keene, NH. Denying our community a full hearing with the opportunity to express our thoughts and concerns about a Liberty Utilities franchise would be unjust.

Keene and the Monadnock region have a long history of environmental stewardship and climate protection. There is a comprehensive Keene Master Plan that identifies goals for addressing climate change. The city has implemented strategies for reducing greenhouse gas emissions including more renewable energy choices. There is a continual effort to update and plan for a future that includes the impacts of decisions relative to energy use and sustainability.
