afternoon. I am Anne Ross, General Counsel at the Public Utilities Commission. I will be presiding as the Hearings Examiner this afternoon at this prehearing conference. We are in West Swanzey Company, Docket DW 17-103. West Swanzey is a New Hampshire corporation, a regulated water utility that provides service to approximately 84 customers in the Town of Swanzey. The Company has filed a Petition for a permanent rate increase. And we are here today to begin that proceeding.

Let's begin by -- was the affidavit of publication filed for this Order of Notice?

MR. ST. CYR: Yes, it was.

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         West Swanzey is a small water company that
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         provides water service to 84 customers. It has
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         three wells, two pump stations, approximately
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         8,700 feet of mains, in both non-fire and fire
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         services, and 83 meters.
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                   In 2016, the Company had revenues of
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         approximately 70,000, operating expenses of
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         approximately 84,000, and interest expenses of
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         approximately 6,000, resulting in a net loss of
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         20,235. The net loss was due primarily to a
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decrease in revenue and an increase in operating expenses. The increase in operating expenses was largely due to a change in operators.

HEARINGS EXAMINER ROSS: And why was it a decrease in revenues in 2016?

MR. ST. CYR: And that's a decrease relative to 2015. And, in 2015, the Company was allowed to recover revenue associated with a step adjustment. And those revenues existed in 2015, but not in 2016.

The Company's rate filing adjusts revenues so that the Company can earn its actual rate of return of 5.05 percent on its actual five-quarter average rate base of \$344,831. The Company made only two minor adjustments to rate base. The Company made no adjustments to its rate of return. If the Commission approves the rate filing as submitted, revenues would increase \$39,872, or approximately 54 percent.

The Company is also proposing a step increase for some additions to plant. Those additions include two VFDs and some SCADA

equipment. And the sum of those amounts would result in an increase of an additional 2,800 -- I'm sorry, \$2,989, or approximately 3 percent.

The Company's looking forward to working with Staff. It anticipates being able to resolve any issues that may arise out of the proceeding. It ultimately expects that the Company will be able to reach a settlement with Staff that will be presented to the Commission for approval.

Thank you.

HEARINGS EXAMINER ROSS: Thank you.

MR. CLIFFORD: Thank you. Staff has reviewed the filings. We do have some concerns about the magnitude of the requested rate increase of \$39,872, as Mr. St. Cyr just described. It's been described in the Petition as "57 percent", and just recently, today, it's "54". So, we want to explore this a little further in a water system of slightly under 100 customers, as well as the proposed step increase of approximately \$3,000.

We are aware, however, that this Company has not filed a general rate

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increase -- or, excuse me, has not filed a request for a general rate -- general increase in rates since 2011. And, since that time, there have been attendant increases in costs and expenses, including the property taxes.

So, we do want to explore the decrease in water revenue described by Mr. St. Cyr and the Company, and as well as the increase in expenses. And we are meeting in a technical session following this prehearing conference, and we will obviously have some discovery questions of our own for the Company.

And we do look forward to working with the Company to get a better understanding of its need for such a large rate increase, and explore the options for a potential settlement in this matter.

And the Staff takes no concrete position at this time. We'd like to explore, through the discovery process, a little bit more of the need for this increase.

HEARINGS EXAMINER ROSS: Thank you.

I assume that, when we close the prehearing

conference, the parties have planned on meeting

in a technical session. Will you be developing a procedural schedule for the docket during that discussion?

MR. CLIFFORD: On behalf of Staff, I can say we do. We've already received a brief outline of a proposed schedule from the Company. So, we're already well on our way to try to resolve this docket as quickly as possible, because we are cognizant of the need to try to get this done before the end of the year, which is the Company's request, if we could do so.

HEARINGS EXAMINER ROSS: Okay. Thank you. In that case, I think there will be very little for me to recommend in my report, except that I will wait to receive a proposed procedural schedule and forward that to the Commissioners for their approval.

MR. CLIFFORD: Yes. And I would -- I intend that we would have a -- we'll probably develop that procedural schedule this afternoon in our technical session, and summit a formal letter to the Executive Director.
