2	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: We are here
3	this morning in Docket DG 18-103, which is a
4	petition for Northern Utilities to expand its
5	franchise to the towns of Kingston and
6	Atkinson, for a prehearing conference. And
7	following that you have a technical session.
8	Before we do anything else, let's
9	take appearances.
L0	MR. TAYLOR: Good morning,
L1	Commissioners. Patrick Taylor on behalf of
L2	Northern Utilities, Inc.
L3	MR. KREIS: Good morning, Chairman
L4	Honigberg and Commissioners. I am D. Maurice
L5	Kreis, the Consumer Advocate, here on behalf
L6	of residential utility customers.
L7	MS. ROSS: Good morning,
L8	Commissioners. Anne Ross, on behalf of
L9	Commission Staff. And with me today is Steve
20	Frink, director of the Gas and Water
21	Division, and Alex Speidel, a Staff attorney.
22	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: The
23	short-timer's table.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Any

preliminary matters before we hear the preliminary positions of the parties? I know we have a red folder, which indicates there's confidential information. Is there anything we need to know about that right now?

Anyone?

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: All right.

Mr. Taylor, why don't you start us off.

MR. TAYLOR: Good morning. The
Company has submitted what it believes to be
a very straightforward petition to expand its
franchise territory into the towns of
Kingston and Atkinson. In both instances the
Company's expansion effort is motivated by a
significant customer that's contracted for
natural gas service from the Company. That
being said, the Company believes that there's
ample opportunity to serve official
residential and commercial customers in
Kingston and Atkinson and looks forward to
providing its services to homeowners and
businesses in those towns.

In many respects, the Company's request to expand its franchise territory in Atkinson is a housekeeping measure. Company, under prior ownership, requested a limited service territory in Atkinson in 1988. In most of the towns where we provide service, the Company has a franchise to operate as a public utility throughout the The Company is already providing town. service in Atkinson, and this petition would merely remove what are now unnecessary borders to enable the Company to provide service to significant projects, like the one being built near the Atkinson Country Club. The Company believes that its petition is very much in the public interest.

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The Kingston Board of Selectmen has submitted a letter in support of the project. And we've also learned that last night the Atkinson Board of Selectmen voted to support the project, and so we expect to see a letter in support from them as well. Both of these projects meet the Company's discounted cash flow analysis and are economical. Expansion

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of natural gas service into these towns will provide economic benefits to residents and businesses.

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We look forward to working with the Staff and the OPA in this docket, and we appreciate your time this morning. Thank you.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Thank you, Mr. Taylor. Mr. Kreis.

MR. KREIS: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. The OPA works in Maine, and so I'm hoping that they're not planning on intervening. But the OCA is here, and we are here to say that we are always interested in making sure that expansion requests of these sorts do not come at the expense of the utility's existing customer base. that I agree with almost everything that Mr. Taylor said, and I think that this particular request will be relatively uncontroversial. And we look forward to working with the Company and with the Commission Staff on bringing this docket to a successful and happy conclusion.

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1 CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Thank you, Mr. 2 Kreis.

Ms. Ross.

MS. ROSS: Yes, Staff has already issued one round of discovery requests and has received responses to most of them and is examining with care the DCF analysis of the profitability of the projects going forward to ensure that Mr. Kreis's concerns about burdening other customers are addressed. This is an analysis that Staff has analyzed in the past, and we intend to do it quickly and would hope to have a favorable resolution. We will certainly work with the parties to get a schedule put together following this hearing.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Any thoughts as to how long that schedule will be? Is this the kind of thing you think will be three months, five months, ten months? What is the thinking? Mr. Taylor?

MS. ROSS: About two months I think from the Staff, at the most. We're going to do our best. We're in a construction season

right now. Both of these projects need to be completed for in-service dates either late this year or early next year, and there's also road work being done this summer. So it makes a lot of sense to get this proposal approved quickly.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: I assume that makes Mr. Taylor happy then.

MR. TAYLOR: Yeah. We have asked for an expedited process in this case, largely to meet construction time lines and to get ahead of a Department of Transportation project that will result in some paving. So we do appreciate it.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: All right. I don't think we have anything else. So if there's nothing else the parties need from us, we will adjourn the prehearing conference and leave you to your technical session. Thank you all.
