New Hampshire Code of Administrative Rules Chapter Puc 1300, Utility Pole Attachment Rules

ORDER OF NOTICE

On November 9, 2017, the Commission voted pursuant to RSA 541-A to initiate a formal rulemaking for N.H. Code Admin. Rules Chapter 1300, Utility Pole Attachment Rules. The Commission's initial proposal represents a readoption of the existing Puc 1300 rules with amendments.

The Puc 1300 rules, adopted pursuant to the statutory mandate of RSA 374:34-a, provide for regulation by the Commission rather than by the Federal Communications Commission of rates, charges, terms, and conditions of utility pole attachments that are just, reasonable, and in the public interest. The rules affect public utilities and other entities that own or co-own poles, and entities such as telecommunications providers, cable television providers, electric service providers, wireless service providers, information service providers, and municipalities that have facilities attached to such poles and/or that seek such attachments.

The proposed amendments to the Puc 1300 rules contain edits, updates, and clarifying changes, as well as certain definitional and substantive revisions intended to clarify the status and rights of wireless service providers and information service providers. The amendments also address issues regarding make-ready work timelines and obligations that have been identified in the course of the Commission's administration of the rules during the past several years. Upon

completion of the formal rulemaking process, the proposed amended rules will replace the current version of Puc 1300.

A notice of rulemaking as required by RSA 541-A:6 (Notice), was filed with the Office of Legislative Services on November 28, 2017, and has been sent to all persons who have made a timely request for advance notice of these rulemaking proceedings. The Notice establishes a public hearing to be held at the Commission on January 24, 2018 at 1:00 p.m. and a deadline for the submission of written comments on February 2, 2018. The Notice as published in the New Hampshire Rulemaking Register is appended hereto. Pursuant to N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 203.12, this Order of Notice will also be published on the Commission's website.

The Initial Proposal for readoption with amendments of the Puc 1300 rules may be viewed on the Commission's website at http://www.puc.nh.gov/Regulatory/Docketbk/2017/17-139.html, or copies may be obtained from the Commission as set forth in the Notice.

Based upon the foregoing, it is hereby

ORDERED, that a Public Hearing, pursuant to RSA 541-A:11, be held before the Commission located at 21 South Fruit Street, Suite 10, Concord, New Hampshire, on January 24, 2018, at 1:00 p.m., and that the deadline for submission of materials in writing or by e-mail shall be February 2, 2018, as set forth in the Notice; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that, pursuant to N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 203.12, the Executive Director shall notify all persons desiring to be heard at this hearing by publishing a copy of this Order of Notice on the Commission's website no later than December 11, 2017.

6. (a) Summary of what the rule says and of any proposed amendments:

The Commission intends to readopt with amendments its Puc 1300 rules. The Puc 1300 rules, pursuant to the statutory mandate of RSA 374:34-a, provide for regulation by the Public Utilities Commission rather than by the Federal Communications Commission of rates, charges, terms, and conditions of utility pole attachments that are just, reasonable, and in the public interest. The proposed amendments contain edits, updates, and clarifying changes, as well as certain definitional and substantive revisions intended to clarify the status and rights of wireless service providers and information service providers. The amendments also address issues regarding make-ready work timelines and obligations that have been identified in the course of the Commission's administration of the rules during the past several years.

The existing Puc 1300 rules are scheduled to expire on December 12, 2017, but are subject to extension pursuant to RSA 541-A:14-a.
